FIVE THINGS TO DO WHILE YOU WAIT

Do you ever feel like you're waiting on God? Maybe you can't relate to the Israelites, who wandered in the desert for 40 years while they were waiting on God to deliver them. But you feel like God has you on hold. He hasn't given you the answer or the deliverance you wanted or expected. God still makes us wander in the desert sometimes—but there is always a purpose to the wait.

When God has you in a waiting period, don't put your life on hold. Instead, imitate the habits that grow strong faith. The Bible says there are five things you should keep on doing in the waiting period.

- 1. Keep on praying. Matthew 7:7 says, "Keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened to you" (NLT). Keep on praying, and you will get your answer.
- 2. Keep on serving. The Bible says in Romans 12:11, "Never be lazy, but work hard and serve the Lord enthusiastically" (NLT). Don't worry about having a significant ministry. Just make your ministry significant.
- 3. Keep on going to small group. "Let us not give up the habit of meeting together... Instead, let us encourage one another all the more, since you see that the Day of the Lord is coming nearer" (Hebrews 10:25 GNT).
- 4. Keep on sowing. Ecclesiastes 11:6 says, "Keep on sowing your seed, for you never know which will grow—perhaps it all will" (TLB). You never know what God will do with the seeds you plant while you're waiting.
- 5. Keep on believing. The Bible says, "You must keep on believing the things you have been taught. You know they are true" (2 Timothy 3:14 TLB).

While you wait, stay active. Don't be passive. God cannot steer a parked car! Don't tell God you're waiting on him. Turn on the ignition, and just start driving. Where? Anywhere! Get involved in a ministry. Get involved in service. Get involved with small group. Do the things you know you could be doing to develop your skills and habits and become more like Jesus.

HEALTH FACTS SNAKEBITES

Venomous snakes are considered those which can inject poison when they bite. In our region of the USA these include the rattlesnake, coral snake, cottonmouth water moccasin, and copperhead.

Bites from these snakes need to treated quickly, so consider it a serious event and call 911. Tell the dispatcher that someone has been bitten by a snake, and if possible, tell them what kind of snake, so that the nearest ER can have antivenom medication ready.

Also, the poison control center help hotline (1-800-222-1222) can be called and you can talk to experts in poisoning and they will give you further instructions.

Meanwhile, keep the person calm. Restrict movement of the area bitten. Remove clothing, rings, watches or anything that might be restrictive. The bitten area will start to swell and change colors due to the venom. If necessary, carry the person to where the ambulance will arrive. Do not apply a tourniquet or an ice pack or wash the wound. Keep the site of the wound below the level of the heart. Do not give the person anything to drink or eat or any medications. Do not cut the wound or try to suck out the venom.

Let's hope none of us have to be in this situation.

My Mother is Mary Frances Friedrich Bail. She showed her love for her family by not only working inside the house but also by working alongside my father on the farm. She saw to it that we were taken to church activities and she was involved. We were taught to respect God's house. I was very much a 'farm girl' but when we went to church you had better wear your Sunday best. Why were we taught to dress up? Because you were to present your BEST to the Lord.

On Saturday nights she would practice the hymns that she would play the next morning at church. Sometimes, we would go to the empty church and she would practice. Being in this big church all alone and listening to the organ is an experience I wish you all could have.

My mother, Wilma Louise Grimes Helmreich was a force to be reckoned with throughout my life and the life of my sister, Jan and brother, Donnie.

She taught us right from wrong. She loved us unconditionally and expected us to respect family, friends, and those in authority. She and my dad worked hard at raising us into responsible Christian adults. In her later years, I witnessed her devotion to God. Early in the mornings, she read her devotional and her Bible. I came in one morning and her head was bowed in prayer. She walked and talked her belief in God by serving others. She set the example she learned from her church attendance and her love of God.

Each Sunday as I sit in Church, I often think of my grandma - also known as Anita or Mombo. Most of you know that I sit in "her pew". Before returning to St Johns, when I would visit her on Sunday, I'd sit here with her and then after church we would eat lunch together at the Bobber - many times Rhea would come with us as well. We would share wonderful conversations, laughter and sometimes tears. She was sitting here in this church when her house burned. This congregation provided her support then as well as during times of grief when her children, my father and my aunt, and her husband "Mr. Ed" or Papa passed away. She is my example of faith during times of hardship and sorrow. Those that know me well sometimes call me "little Mombo", which I consider the highest compliment.

There are so many words of wisdom she imparted on me and many of you as well. You probably received a card from her at some point she would usually underline important words with red ink - and sometimes allow Papa to sign as well with his stick figure wearing a top hat.

Mombo's sayings to live by remain with me and I'd like to share them with you.

- 1) A job worth doing is worth doing well. I use this in my teaching career daily.
- 2) A penny saved is a penny earned. Papa would always joke that he got his weekly allowance of \$20 to spend!
- 3) Haste makes waste.

There is always so much to do, but I sometimes need to remember those first words of wisdom and not rush too quickly to finish a job but rather spend quality time making sure the job is done correctly.

And lastly, this poem was one of her favorites that she often recited to me and one my mother would often recite it to my children when she picked them up from preschool:

Good, Better, Best Never let it rest Till the Good is Better and the Better is Best.
