### HEALTH FACTS Listeria

Listeria is a foodborne bacterial illness that can be fatal to unborn babies, newborns, and people with weakened immune systems.

Symptoms can occur a few days or even up to 30 days after eating contaminated food. The bacteria can be found in soil, water, and animal feces. People can get infected by eating raw vegetables from contaminated soil, contaminated meat, unpasteurized milk or milk products, certain processed foods such as soft cheeses, hot dogs, deli meats that have been contaminated after processing.

Symptoms of infection are fever, chills, muscle aches, nausea, diarrhea. If you have these symptoms after eating recalled food, call your doctor. Blood and urine samples can diagnosis Listeria infection. Serious infections are treated with antibiotics.

To prevent Listeria, simply use food safety guidelines such as washing hands before and after handling food; use hot, soapy water to clean dishes, cutting boards, and work surfaces. Clean raw vegetables with scrub brush and running water. Cook food to designated proper temperature.

All week I was trying to get Dave Muntzel's phone number to ask him about some trees. Finally, I decided to just get it from him at church on Sunday. He wasn't there, but Holly got it from Julie (the secretary). Anyway, the day was very nice, and Holly got Dave's number in my phone before going to KC around 3 pm to help her 98 yr. old mother. I talked with Dave sometime later that afternoon. Holly called to say good night around 6:30, all was fine. I went in to go to bed between 7:30-8, when I laid down, I noticed something was really wrong. The paintings on the wall didn't lineup and were all out of focus. I thought I should try to call someone, my daughter, Christie was closest, so I thought to try her. The phone signal is poor in that room, but I decided to try to call anyway. My first attempt was at 8:12, but it didn't work. I kept trying over and over nothing went through. Fifteen calls and 34 minutes later I finally cried out, "Please, God, help me call anybody!" The next time I tried, the phone rang, and Dave answered it. Then I knew for sure God was listening and helping.

Dave had been my 'most recent' call, and he was the best person. He recognized immediately that I needed help and took charge. He reached out to Eddie Wassmann, who got the ambulance on the way and reached out to Julie for Holly and Christie's phone numbers to get them on the way. Dave and his wife, Ann, hopped in their truck to meet the ambulance on Bellair. I, meanwhile, thought I could call other people, I couldn't see the phone, but I kept trying. That's when I found out for sure that the phone didn't work, but God did! Seemed like lots of help came right away, and all at the same time. I recognized Christie and my grandson, Jacob, and Dave, but no one else. Both the Pilot Grove Fire Department and the Boonville Ambulance had come. When they asked how I felt, I started puking everywhere, so they knew I wasn't ok. Somehow, they put me in a chair and got me upstairs. It was cold and bumpy. They got me on a bed in the ambulance and gave me some stuff like in the movies. I felt us going down the driveway onto the gravel road, then to HWY 5, and off we went. When I was laying there, I was just thinking about how I didn't have talk with the dumb phone anymore. They got me to the hospital. Christie and Jacob were there, and Holly was on the way. I felt safe and I knew for sure GOD ANSWERED MY PRAYER. I want to thank everyone that has helped me in so many ways during my illness and the many people that have sent prayers.
