HEALTH FACTS Osteoporosis

Osteoporosis is a disease that occurs when the body loses too much bone, makes too little bone or both. As a result, bones become weak and may break from a fall or even a minor bump.

Osteoporosis is often called a silent disease because most people don't know they have it until they break a bone.

Regular bone mineral density screening can help detect osteoporosis. Begin screening for women after age 65 and men after age 70.

You can receive medication to reduce bone destruction and practice weight bearing exercises. Ask your health provider for more information regarding screening and treatment and follow the guidelines recommended.
