HEALTH FACTS Gingivitis

Gingivitis is a common and mild form of gum disease. It causes irritation, redness, swelling, and bleeding of the gums at the base of the teeth. It can be caused by poor oral hygiene.

Risk factors are smoking or chewing tobacco, dry mouth, poor nutrition, poor fitting bridges or dental implants, and illegal drug use. Bacteria from the mouth can enter the bloodstream and end up in the heart or lungs.

To prevent gingivitis, brush your teeth twice a day, floss between teeth daily, and see the dentist biannually.
