FYI: From Samaritan's Purse OCC Regarding Soap

"This year, we announced that Operation Christmas Child is phasing out soap. Because soap touches a child's skin, a country's Food and Drug Authority often regulates it. Currently, at least two dozen of our receiving countries regulate the importation of soap, and we're seeing that number grow. This means at least 3 million shoeboxes each year are going into countries where soap can be a concern. These countries have shown a history of, when soap is found in one shoebox, flagging all shoebox gifts for further inspection, causing delays or legal ramifications for partners on the ground. This results in inflated, unsustainable amounts of ministry costs and delays. We want to avoid these challenges and don't want anything to delay sharing the Gospel with children. Phasing out soap means we are discouraging the inclusion of soap in shoebox gifts. However, if soap is included in a shoebox gift this year, it will not be removed at the processing centers unless special processing is required for a specific country. At some point in the future, soap will likely be added to the inappropirate list."

So all of that being said, let's just NOT include any soap in the boxes we pack. We want all of our boxes to get to children without delay! NOPE TO SOAP!!!

Rhea and I were blessed to attend an Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Project Workshop recently in California, MO. We were impressed by all of the enthusiastic, excited people of all ages who were packing boxes! The leaders emphasized these three points about our boxes this year. We need to make them FUN, FULL AND PERSONALIZED! "Shoebox gifts are like snowflakes--no two are alike!" This is a quote by Franklin Graham, President of Samaritan's Purse. I will be talking about this during Children's Time on SUNDAY, OCTOBER 13

Remember to include school supplies, personal care items, toys, and a note from you, (include a picture if possible) with your email address on it. There are lots of ideas on a list inside the shoebox. If you pack a shoebox, you do not need to include the \$10 postage.

I realize that everyone is not able to prepare a box. So, if you are unable to fill a box, but would like to participate in this life-changing project, we would sincerely appreciate your donation for postage. It costs \$10 to send each box. This covers collecting, processing, shipping, training local churches, and producing THE GREATEST GIFT GOSPEL booklets. HEALTH FACTS Alzheimer's Disease

Concerns about cognitive health and memory or thinking issues can be intimidating to confront, but early symptomatic Alzheimer's disease should not be dismissed as normal aging. Timely detection and accurate diagnosis are essential.

Symptoms can be worsening memory loss, difficulty completing familiar tasks, confusion with time or place, new problems with words in speaking or writing, misplacing things and losing the ability to retrace steps.

Timely diagnosis can help identify or eliminate Alzheimer's disease as the cause of a person's memory and thinking issues. Diagnosis can be done by PET scans of the brain to see if amyloid plaques are present. Biomarkers in the blood and spinal fluid can also be performed.

Medications are available to slow the progression of Alzheimer's disease. The important thing is to have a plan for the future so that personal and medical decisions can be made with your loved one.
